We are happy to announce the Call for the 8th EU and Comparative Law Issues and Challenges Series (ECLIC) International Scientific Conference "EU at the crossroads – ways to preserve democracy and rule of law", Osijek, Croatia. As part of its commitment to the study of EU law, this year's conference of the Faculty of Law Osijek aims to highlight various legal, economic and social issues and challenges of the European Union.

Democracy and the rule of law are foundational principles that underpin the European Union's (EU) political and legal landscape. The EU, comprised of member states with different legal traditions, has actively sought to establish a framework that promotes democratic governance and upholds the rule of law. The Treaty on European Union explicitly states the commitment to the rule of law as a fundamental value. This commitment extends to establishing a legal order that governs the relationship between member states, EU institutions, and individuals. The Court of Justice of the European Union serves as the guardian of the rule of law, ensuring that EU law is interpreted and applied consistently across member states. However, the EU has faced challenges in recent years that have tested the resilience of these principles. Concerns about the erosion of the rule of law in some member states have prompted the EU to explore mechanisms to safeguard its foundational values. This year conference aims to explore the current state of democracy and the rule of law within the European Union, identifying key challenges and opportunities while focusing on the legal frameworks and institutional structures in place. Investigate the impact of emerging technologies on democracy and the rule of law, addressing issues such as AI, digital governance, cybersecurity, and the protection of fundamental rights. Analyze the EU's role in the global context, considering its influence on democracy and the rule of law beyond its borders and

exploring potential collaborations with international partners. Finally, this year conference aims to explore the social and economic factors that contribute to the resilience or erosion of democratic values, and discuss strategies for fostering these challenges.

The overall objective of the ECLIC International Scientific Conference is to provide a platform and stimulate discussion on key interdisciplinary issues affecting law and economics in the EU and its Member States. We strongly encourage participants from candidate states for the EU accession to attend to conference and contribute to discussion.

We are looking forward to receiving manuscripts covering, primarily, but not exclusively topics mentioned above.
