THE SYSTEM OF LEGAL REGULATION OF ENERGY SECTOR IN RUSSIA: CURRENT CONCEPTS AND DEVELOPMENT TRENDS

S.A. Svirkov

Doctor of Law, Associate Professor, Head of the Department of Energy Law, Kutafin Moscow State Law University (MSAL), leading expert in the regulation of Russian energy sector.

S.A. Svirkov has extensive practical experience working in senior positions at major energy companies, combining this with research and teaching. His primary research interests include the development of legal regulation in the energy sector in Russia and other countries, energy security, digital transformation of the energy sector, alternative energy, energy market organization, contractual regulation, competition and antitrust regulation in the energy sector.

He is the author of over 100 research and educational works, including three monographs on regulation of relations in the energy supply sector, master's program "Energy Law", and a co-author of civil law textbooks published by the Department of Civil Law at the Kutafin Moscow State Law University and the Department of Civil Law at the Faculty of Law at Lomonosov Moscow State University.

S.A. Svirkov is a member of the expert council of the Federal Antimonopoly Service of Russia. Hirsch index for all publications in the Russian Science Citation Index (RSCI) is 7. The number of citations from publications in the RSCI is 523.

At its core, energy sector is a technology (primarily the technology of energy production and use, and the operation of energy facilities and equipment). Furthermore, it encompasses economic relations including energy supply and functioning of energy markets, as well as the social sphere (as the basis of social development and life support). Law is present at all stages, permeating and strengthening these levels of relations. Therefore, energy law represents a projection of the entire legal system in relation to this critically important sector of the economy and industry.
